

**Notice of Green Acres Public Hearing  
Administrative Transfer of Parkland  
Milford Bluffs Preserve,  
Block 24, Lot 4  
Township of Holland, Hunterdon County, NJ**

The Nature Conservancy, 200 Pottersville Road, Chester, NJ 07930, will hold a public hearing to obtain comments regarding the proposed administrative transfer of parkland owned by The Nature Conservancy to New Jersey Natural Lands Trust. This transfer is subject to NJDEP Commissioner and State House Commission approval.

The public hearing will be held April 7, 2008 at 7:00 PM at the Holland Township Town Hall Meeting Room, 61 Church Road, Milford, NJ. All interested parties are invited to attend and participate in the public hearing. In addition to oral comments presented during the hearing, written comments may be submitted to the agencies listed below. All written comments must be received within two weeks following the hearing, by April 21, 2008.

The proposed administrative transfer of parkland would involve a transfer of the deed to Block 24, Lot 4 from The Nature Conservancy to New Jersey Natural Lands Trust. The transferred property shall continue to be used solely for recreation and conservation purposes and shall be reasonably accessible to the public to the same extent as or greater than prior to the transfer. The Green Acres restrictions and any other applicable recreation and conservation restrictions on the parkland shall continue to apply. The 36.78 acres of parkland to be transferred will be added to the adjoining 166.22 acre New Jersey Natural Lands Trust Thomas F. Breden Preserve at Milford Bluffs on Lot 7, Block 24.
