

**THE NATURE CONSERVACY'S NEW JERSEY CHAPTER

From I-80:

Take I-80 to Rt. 206 SOUTH. Travel approximately 8.2 miles on Rt. 206 South to the intersection of Rt. 24/ 513 and Rt. 206. (Larison's Turkey Farm Restaurant on the right corner) Go straight through the intersection.

SOUTH ON RT. 206

Travel approximately 1.5 miles past this intersection, heading south on 206, to Pottersville Road on the right. You are looking for the right turn just before the mileage sign for Somerville/ Princeton/Trenton.

Make a RIGHT turn onto Pottersville Road. After you make the turn, you will travel approximately 50 yards to a "T". Please make a left then a quick right on to Pottersville Road. (At that point there are street signs to direct you).

Go approximately 0.9 of a mile to the entrance of the park on your RIGHT. There is a white wooden fence on the right just prior to the park entrance, and the driveway is marked with a tall brown sign with white lettering that reads, "The Elizabeth D. Kay Environmental Center, Morris County Park System." Follow the driveway to the parking lot at the end.

From I-287 NORTH:

Take I-287 North to Exit 22 (202/206 Bedminster/ Pluckemin). The exit ramp becomes a lane on 202/206 North. You'll want to get into the left lane, as 206 North splits off to the left shortly after River Road.

NORTH ON RT. 206

Travel approximately 5 miles on Rt. 206 north to Pottersville Road (Somerset County 512) traffic light. DO NOT TURN HERE. Go straight through this intersection and follow Route 206 North for another 3.4 miles until you come to another Pottersville Road on the LEFT. You will need to take a left hand turn lane for this purpose on Route 206. Turn left onto Pottersville Road. After you make the turn, you will travel approximately 50 yards to a "T". Please make a left then a quick right on to Pottersville Road. (At that point there are street signs to direct you).

Go approximately 0.9 of a mile to the entrance of the park on your RIGHT. There is a white wooden fence on the right just prior to the park entrance, and the driveway is marked with a tall brown sign with white lettering that reads, "The Elizabeth D. Kay Environmental Center, Morris County Park System." Follow the driveway to the parking lot at the end.
