In just the last few months, record shattering temperatures and an above-average hurricane season have cost shellfish growers untold millions in property damage and product loss. With the added challenges of rising sea levels, ocean acidification, changing rainfall patterns, algal blooms, the spread of disease, and increasing water temperatures, it's getting harder and harder to grow shellfish.

Financial and environmental pressures have already forced some growers to leave the industry, and more will likely follow suit as the climate continues to change.
