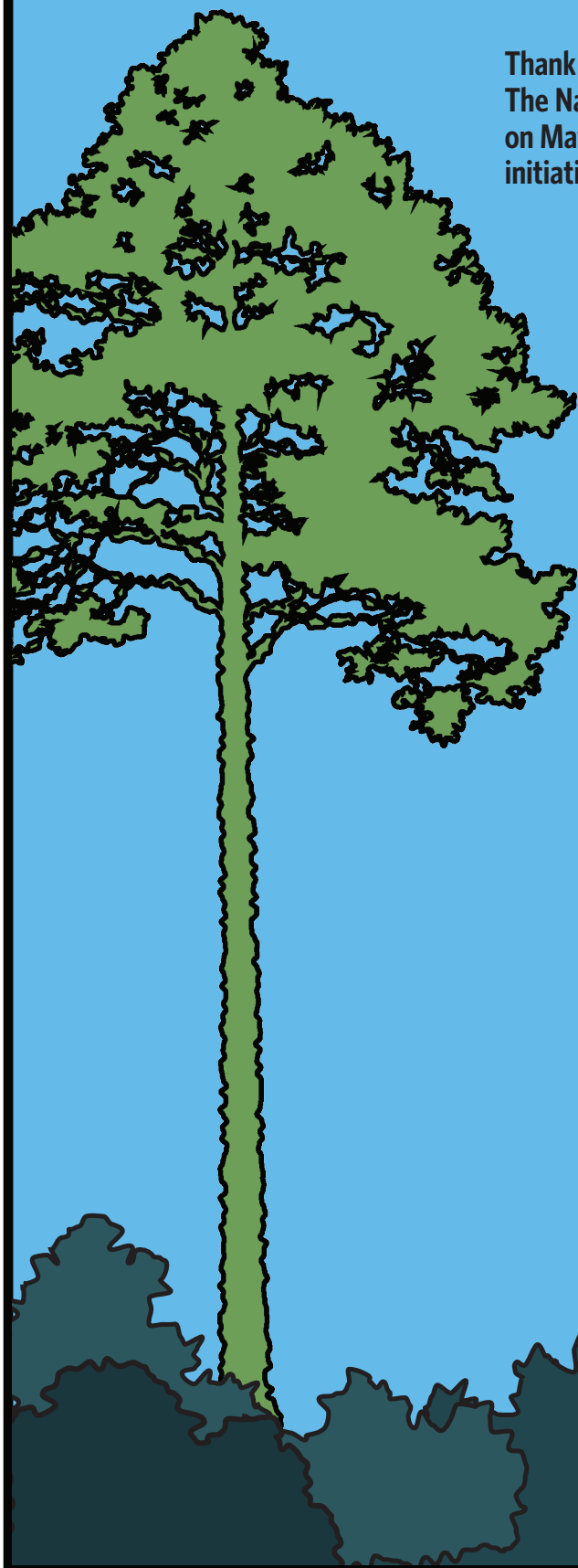

You'll explore a freshwater tidal portion of the river in Camden County and learn about The Nature Conservancy's community-based conservation efforts to implement nature-based solutions, like protected floodplains, to help our coast adapt to increased coastal flooding.

- Conservation Field Trip: Chattahoochee Fall Line Field Trip with Brant Slay | May 14, 2019
 - o You and a guest will join The Nature Conservancy's CFL Conservation Manager, Brant Slay for a special preview of the Hilliard Tract on the Chattahoochee Fall Line. The Fall Line is an extremely unique region that separates the Piedmont from the Upper Coastal Plain. This portion of the ancient shoreline is home to many threatened and endangered species that include the red cockaded woodpecker, gopher tortoise, gopher frogs, sweet pitcher plants, parrot pitcher plants, and many more. Explore the history of longleaf pine, the diversity of species, and their dependence on fire. Also, learn how a partnership between The Nature Conservancy and the Army at Fort Benning has provided conservation protection for this portion of the western Fall Line.

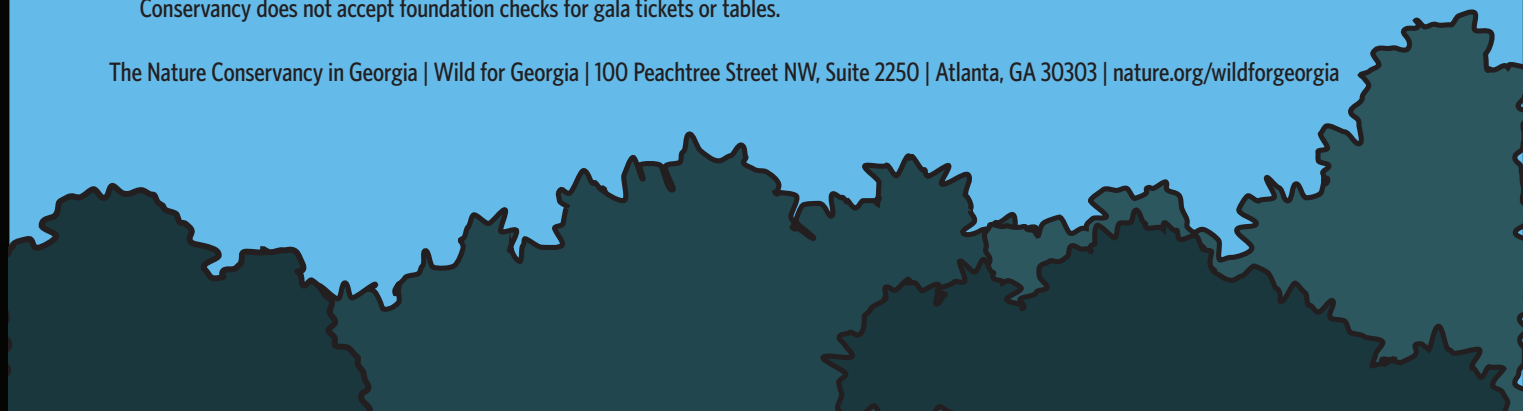
