Troegs & TNC's Mural



Created by artist Emily Ding and sponsored by The Nature Conservancy and Tröegs Brewery, a new mural was unveiled this past weekend during Harrisburg's Mural Fest Block Party event. The beautiful image stands two-stories high and 80-feet wide depicting bird species found along the Kittatinny Ridge. You will find the mural on the side of a deli, located at 512 N. 3rd Street in downtown Harrisburg. It is estimated to be there for next 30 years. This was one of 10 murals commissioned in the city for 2019.

September 2019 Question:

How many natural lakes (over 20 acres wide in size) are found in Pennsylvania?

Answer for August Trivia: The **Johnstown Flood** is ranked as one of the top 3 worst natural disasters in U.S. history. The South Fork Dam was located just fourteen miles upstream from Johnstown and it created the Lake Conemaugh reservoir. After a few days of the heavy rainfall in May of 1889, the dam gave out, suddenly releasing all 20 million tons of the lake's water upon the town. 2, 209 people perished, including over 900 families and over 300 children.
