

## **The Nature Conservancy**

#### **Chesapeake Bay Grant**

The Nature Conservancy announced that it has been awarded a grant of nearly \$1 million through the Chesapeake Bay Stewardship Fund (CBSF) to accelerate wetland restoration efforts across the Chesapeake Bay watershed.

The grant was one of 47 announced this fall by the National Fish and Wildlife
Foundation (NFWF), which partners on the fund with two other EPA grant programs. An additional \$2.5 million in funding will be leveraged from the grant from the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, the Virginia Outdoors Foundation, Ducks Unlimited and other partners.
