Thrive Outside Chicago Background

Chicago is a city with extensive green space including forest preserves, community gardens, and nearly 9,000 acres of parkland. Despite this vast network of public green space, there are still many communities in Chicago that have not been equitably connected to green spaces or programs designed to promote recreation and enjoyment of the outdoors. Historic exclusion, violence and segregation have left lasting impacts on our communities and have hindered equitable outdoor access. The barriers faced by communities attempting to access the outdoors are as diverse as the communities themselves. For some, lack of transportation becomes a barrier when outdoor programs are not offered close to home. Others may lack the gear or training to partake in new or unfamiliar activities. Lack of culturally relevant programming and lack of accessible and language-appropriate signage and communications materials compound to further the gap in access to nature for many Chicagoans, especially among communities of color, Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, and Asexual (LGBTQIA+) and people with disabilities. While there are many grassroots efforts working to improve outdoor access for historically excluded groups, organizations often operate with limited staff capacity and funding. Smaller community-based organizations have the strong local relationships and trust needed to encourage people to get outdoors in their communities, but often lack access to sustainable funding to support their efforts. Additionally, organizations need capacity-building opportunities and direct relationships with funders.

Thrive Outside Chicago was created to help address the systemic barriers faced by communities that have been historically excluded from outdoor programming. Guided by The Nature Conservancy, Thrive Outside Chicago convenes a network of partners that are providing meaningful outdoor engagement opportunities for youth and adults, particularly for Black, Indigenous, and Other People of Color (BIPOC), LGBTQIA+, people with disabilities.

Thrive Outside Chicago aspires to strengthen our network partners through capacity-building opportunities and access to funding, our communities with increased access to recreation and outdoor programming, and our city by making the outdoors part of the fabric of the lives of all Chicagoans. While Thrive Outside Chicago is currently focused on the South and West neighborhoods of Chicago, our goal is to extend our reach to other parts of the city as we move forward in the years to come.

Thrive Outside Chicago partners are focused on supporting:

- Youth-centered environmental education
- Outdoor recreation
- Growing plants within but not limited to community, educational, and school gardens
- Environmental justice
- Environmental stewardship
- Citizen science in green spaces
- Community health and wellness

Thrive Outside Chicago invites organizations that are engaging youth and families in the outdoors in the south and west neighborhoods of Chicago to become part of the Thrive Outside Chicago initiative. Thrive Outside Gear and Supplies Fund 2024

To help meet the needs of organizations dedicated to reducing barriers to the outdoors, the Thrive Outside Gear and Supplies Fund was created to provide outdoor recreation gear, stewardship supplies, tools, recreation equipment, adaptive gear, and other materials groups need to provide meaningful outdoor programming opportunities for communities in the South and West Sides of Chicago. **Organizations can request up to \$1,250 in gear and supplies.** To make a request, please complete the questions on the attached application. **We will accept applications until February 23, 2024**

Applicant Eligibility:

- Organizations working with communities that have historically been underrepresented in the outdoors, with priority given to those organizations that are engaging Chicagoans in the South and West Side neighborhoods. Please see below for specific geographical priorities.
- Applications will be accepted from organizations that engage BIPOC, LGBTQIA+, people with disabilities, and/or other groups that have been historically excluded in the outdoors.

Applications will be evaluated by the following criteria:

- Applicant clearly shows that they engage historically underrepresented populations served in Chicago (i.e., BIPOC, LGBTQIA+, people with disabilities, etc.)
- Communities served are based on the South and West Sides of Chicago. We are focusing on the South and West Sides of Chicago due to the historical underrepresentation of residents in the outdoors. We plan to expand our range of areas served within Chicago in the future. - Items requested clearly match the needs and request of the organization.
- Applicant clearly states their intended outcomes.

You will be notified by end of March of 2024 if your funding request has been approved. *We will do our best to accommodate your total request, but full request awards cannot be guaranteed.* If approved, you will receive a letter indicating the amount of funds available to your group. **It is important to note that the award is not a grant (you will not receive the money in advance). Either you will be reimbursed in a timely manner for expenses approved through this process or tools and supplies will be ordered and shipped to you directly.** Eligible recipients and grantees will become a part of the Thrive Outside Chicago network. *

Examples of use for funding include but are not limited to:

Gardening tools & supplies for growing plants

Life vests, tools, paddles, climbing harnesses, etc.

Interpretive tools like binoculars, microscopes, guides, bird guides, magnifying glasses, etc.

Outdoor clothing and apparel

Adaptive gear purchasing or modifications

Food and refreshments for participants
