- Open daylight hours for hiking, birdwatching and respectful public use.
- No motor vehicles, horses, bicycles, trapping, camping or fires.
- Please make your visit low impact. No gathering flowers, collecting plants or disturbing birds and wildlife.
- Stay on the marked trail at all times to protect this sensitive environment. Please watch your step, some areas may be wet or uneven.
- Please be advised the spur trail to Canadice Lake is a challenging trail that is steep and minimally maintained.

TRAVEL DIRECTIONS

From the NYS Thruway, take Interstate 390 South to Exit 11, take NYS route 251 East to Rush, take NYS Route 15A South through Hemlock, continue up the hill to South Old Bald Hill Road, look for the preserve sign on the left.

PRESERVE HISTORY

Rob's Trail Preserve is nestled among the high ridges and rolling hills of the Finger Lakes. The trail connects the only two undeveloped Finger Lakes, Hemlock and Canadice Lakes—the primary source of drinking water for Rochester.

In 2010, NYS DEC, the City of Rochester and The Nature Conservancy teamed up to protect more than 7,000 acres surrounding Hemlock and Canadice Lakes. The Nature Conservancy owns a critical parcel connecting the watershed lands. With the help of volunteers, a trail was built in 2016 that makes it possible to hike from one lake to the other.
